London Visit

Last week some of the Y6 children took part in a residential visit to London. Over the three days they visited the Natural History Museum, the Science Museum and took a flight on the London Eye. They also went on a tour around the Houses of Parliament and walked around Buckingham Palace, Whitehall, Chinatown, Hyde Park and Trafalgar Square. One of the main highlights was going into Downing Street where they met with Rishi Sunak for a question and answer session. The children asked some fantastic questions! They then went to the



theatre and enjoyed the spectacular production of The Lion King. A lot of learning was packed into a short period and it was also great to receive some lovely comments about their good behaviour over the visit.

Art workshop



On Friday 24th June, we welcomed artist Kate Smith to school to do workshops with Y1/2 children and an advanced workshop with some KS2

artists. Kate taught the children to sketch and paint a brightly coloured boat following her style and techniques including creating the reflection in the water using sticks and palette knives. It was fabulous for the children to learn from a professional artist and everyone enjoyed their workshop. After school, parents were able to visit the 'gallery' of

Summer Reading Challenge

Children are invited to discover the amazing science and innovation behind the world around them as part of this year's Summer Reading Challenge with the theme Gadgeteers.

North Yorkshire libraries and the Reading Agency is running the challenge for children aged 4 to 11, encouraging them to read six library books over the summer holiday period.

Gadgeteers aims to show children that science is all around them, and helps them with whatever they love doing. To take part children need to sign up at their nearest library where they will be given a colourful fold out poster showing the setting for this year's Challenge - an imaginary community centre.

As they read their chosen books, they will receive stickers (some scratch & sniff!) and can use them to help the Gadgeteers come up with great inventions for an amazing summer party at the centre. There are more free incentives to collect along the way and those who complete the Challenge will receive a medal and a certificate to celebrate their achievement.

Children can choose from a vast range of books at the library or download them as an eBook from the catalogue. There are loads of fantastic new books about science and inventions but they can choose any six library books to count towards the challenge.

There will also be lots of great events in our libraries throughout the summer, including junk modelling, Lego sessions, science workshops, art and craft sessions, storytelling and theatre performances to name but a few! The Challenge starts on Saturday 16th July and finishes on Saturday 10th September
