Welcome back to a new half term!

We hope that everyone enjoyed the half term break and that the children are looking forward to their learning projects this half term. There is some exciting learning planned for the next seven weeks in the run up to Christmas! This week has seen children painting in the style of artists such as Van Gogh, developing their understanding of colour theory, exploring the story of Little Red Riding Hood and even some James Bond inspired dance work.

Across school this week we have also been learning more about Remembrance Day. The Reception children spent time learning about Remembrance Day and what it means to us, baking some tasty Remembrance Day buns and sharing <u>BBC iPlayer - Poppies</u>. Year 5/6 walked down to the Romanby war memorial and discussed the impact of both World Wars on our local area, before having time to create a piece of artwork or writing inspired by what they saw. After that, volunteers read famous poems such as 'Lest We Forget'. Finally, they observed a moment of silence in an act of remembrance.

Y5/6 Football

On Wednesday the 8th of November, we went to a football tournament at Northallerton Leisure Centre. There were five other teams taking part: Applegarth; Alverton; Brompton; Broomfield and Mill Hill.
