Staying Safe on Roads, Playgrounds and Near Railways

This week, the children in KS1 and KS2 took part in an assembly all about staying safe in and around our community. With our school's close proximity to both busy roads and the railway, it's vital that our children understand how to keep themselves and others safe. We talked about the importance of:

- **Not riding bikes or scooters across the playground** to prevent accidents and keep everyone safe during busy drop-off and pick-up times.
- Using crossings safely, looking both ways, and being alert when near roads.
- Railway safety, including the dangers of trespassing on tracks, the importance of staying behind barriers, and how fast and quiet trains can be.

The children listened brilliantly and asked thoughtful questions. We're proud of how seriously they took the message, and we encourage families to continue these conversations at home.

Keeping Our Children and Young People Healthy and Well in North Yorkshire

Think Pharmacy First

We have been asked to share the following information with parents.

Most pharmacies in England are now providing the Pharmacy First service.

This free NHS service allows you or your child to get quick access to healthcare advice for the following seven conditions:

- Earache (aged 1 to 17 years)
- Impetigo (aged 1 year and over)
- Infected insect bites (aged 1 year and over)
- Shingles (aged 18 years and over)
- Sinusitis (aged 12 years and over)
- Sore throats (aged 5 years and over)
- Urinary tract infections (UTIs) in women (aged 16 to 64 years)

If you or your child has symptoms that suggest you may have one of these conditions, you can walk into a pharmacy and be offered a consultation with a pharmacist in a private consultation room. The pharmacist will provide advice and, if clinically necessary, a prescription medicine to treat the condition (the normal NHS prescription charge rules apply to people aged 16 and over).
