Festival of Remembrance

Some of our Service children went to Ripon Cathedral for the Remembrance service as representatives from our school. This special event recognizes the unique sacrifices made by children whose parents serve in the military. Thank you also to our brilliant military personnel dads who volunteered to support the visit.

As well as our Remembrance Day assembly in school the Y5/6 pupils showed great respect when visiting the Romanby War Memorial. They shared poems and reflections before sketching their surroundings and learning more about our local history.

With the support and assistance of some key partners, North Yorkshire Police have been delivering Crucial Crew safety workshops to Year 6 pupils across the region for over twenty years. Our Year 6 children really enjoyed their morning at Crucial Crew last week. The workshop sessions covered vital personal safety and behaviour topics such as road safety, internet safety, water safety and how to make an emergency call, and much, much more.
