National Year of Reading 2026

As part of the National Year of Reading, the Department for Education (DfE) and the National Literacy Trust have launched the 'Go All In' campaign, encouraging people of all ages to rediscover reading for pleasure. This follows data revealing only one in three 8 to 18 year olds saying they enjoy reading.

The campaign aims to bring together families, schools, libraries, businesses and other community organisations to connect reading with everyday passions such as football, music, food, film and gaming. Activities will include national events, local community programmes, volunteer opportunities and new resources for parents and schools.

We have some exciting ideas planned to encourage all children to read for pleasure and we know lots of children are already keen readers.

Making the curriculum come to life

We try to make lessons as engaging and relevant to real life as we can. Visits play a part in this but we also value the support we get from our local community and further afield. A big thank you to one of our Reception parents for coming into school with their new baby as part of our current EYFS learning project. The children in Y5/6 were able to gain a much better understanding of polar environments with a visit from Dr Rosie Chance from York University who shared examples of her scientific work in these environments.
