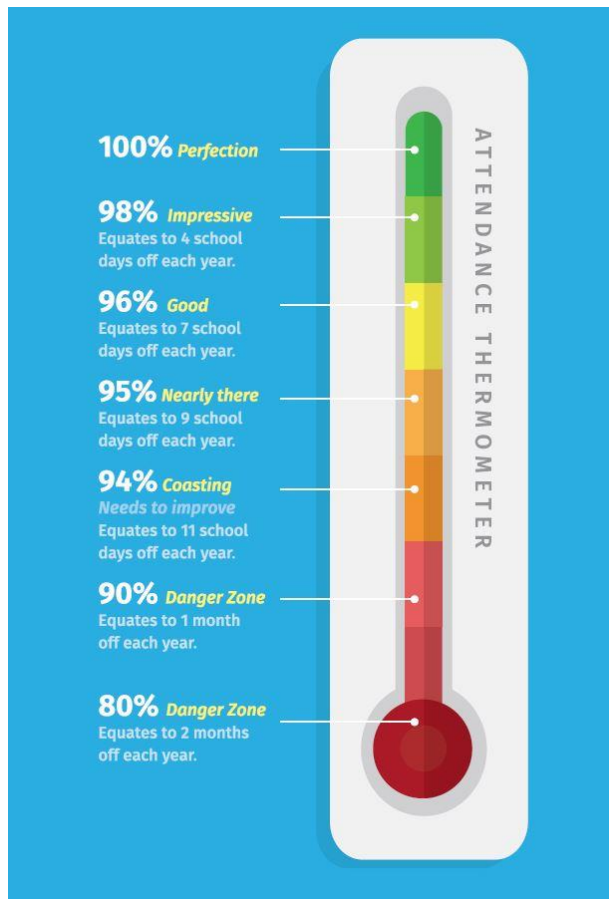
Stars of the week
